In the quiet reverie of the stage lights, we bid farewell to John Anthony "Tigger" Falkenbach, a luminary whose artistic brilliance illuminated our lives for 65 remarkable years. Departing on November 23, 2023, John's legacy is not just a tapestry of theatrical excellence but a testament to a life lived with a generous spirit and a deep commitment to community service.

Born on July 23, 1958, in Mansfield, Ohio, John's journey through life was a symphony of passion for the arts. A graduate of Catholic Central High School in 1976 and an alumnus of Ohio Northern University, he spent over four decades as a financial consultant and accountant, most recently dedicating 16 years of service to Robert Half International.

Yet, it was on the stage that John's heart truly found its home. Engaged in community, educational, and professional theatre for nearly 50 years, he was a versatile force, contributing as a director, lighting designer, producer, actor, and techie. His warmth and creativity earned him a remarkable 51 Daytony awards, including 40 for Lighting Design and four for Set Design. In 2018, he was honored with induction into the Dayton Theatre Hall of Fame.

Beyond the spotlight, John's giving nature extended to the community he cherished. Ready to serve in any capacity, his kindness and willingness to contribute were as prominent as his artistic skills. His influence was not confined to the stage; he played a pivotal role in opening the first Little Caesar's Pizza franchise in Springfield, Ohio. An avid enthusiast of Winnie the Pooh's Tigger, John's joyful spirit transcended into his love for chess, cards, and games, which he shared generously with family and friends.

John's legacy is not just a trail of awards and accolades; it's a legacy of love, creativity, and selflessness. Survived by his loving mother, Mary Ann Hudson, and stepmother, Carol Falkenbach, John leaves behind siblings who were not only family but also witnesses to his inspiring influence: David Michael (Debbie) Falkenbach, Mary Beth (Mark) Goodin, and Gary Joseph (Rita) Falkenbach. His brother-in-law Robb Butterfield and nieces and nephews: Bradley, Jeremy (Caleb), Seth (Matt), Kayla (Mike), Justin (Julie), and one great-nephew, Syre, share in the grief of losing this extraordinary soul.

As the curtains fall on John Anthony "Tigger" Falkenbach's earthly performance, let us remember not only his immense skill but also the kindness that set him apart. His legacy lives on not just in the footlights but in the hearts he touched with his artistry and his unwavering spirit of giving to the community he so dearly loved. We recognize John one last time as we bid him farewell, knowing that the accolades he received will never meet the inspiring life Tigger lived.
